Perinatal Mood and Anxiety Disorders

Perinatal Mood and Anxiety Disorders (PMADs) are not the same as “Baby Blues.” Identifying these conditions early through routine screening and education in OB offices and birthing hospitals is essential to (1) reduce stigma (2) educate families about empirically supported treatments available locally and (3) provide women with resources they need before the conditions chronically affect the mother, her fetus/ infant, older children and entire family.

Recent California legislation requires hospitals to develop and implement a program to provide education and information to appropriate health care professionals and patients about maternal mental health conditions.

In honor of Social Work Month, the Medical Social Work Department is highlighting the important role that health care professionals can play in routine screening and education, while also reflecting on current practices and resources available in our community.

The goal of the forum is for health care professionals to broaden their clinical knowledge of PMADs, in addition to understanding best practices for assessing, screening, and identifying resources to fulfill the legislative requirements.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

1. Review recent legislation related to PMADs and Impacts on health care providers at Cottage Health
2. Define PMADs including prevalence rates and risk factors
3. Discuss the Postpartum Depression Screening findings from a large California hospital (Cedars-Sinai)
4. Identify barriers to proper screening, education and referral to care
